

The neighborhood has access to a great number of green spaces, including the Ben Franklin Community Garden, Loew Park, Cleveland Metroparks Zoo, and more! These amenities, on top of affordable housing, a thriving business sector, and easy access to the surrounding greater Cleveland area, make Old Brooklyn a great place to grow for people from all walks of life.

A 5-acre site with 200 community garde plots, perennial garden, children's garden, demonstration garden and orchard.

1 2014 Tampa Ave

Imagine a grandiose Victorian era garden on the English countryside packed into a tiny Old Brooklyn backyard! Features a patio, greenhouse, many varieties of trees and perennials, and one giant locust tree covering it all.

7 4544 Broadale Rd

My garden is eclectic. If I see it and like it, I plant it.

8 4465 South Hills Dr

Front and back. No grass in front, 20 raised beds in back. Perennials, fruit and vegetables

9 1509 Ferman Ave

Bold colors this year — my gardens attract hummingbirds and butterflies. A cooling shade garden in the back caps off a variety of beds. Come see what you can create on a city lot.

10 1333 and 1505 Ferman Ave

Nine separate annual, perennial flower and herb gardens surround 2 homes in a peaceful park-like setting in Old Brooklyn. Each garden is themed, named for moments or memories we cherish. There's even a "Secret Garden" beyond a gate. Mike keeps deer away with drones. Come and see the flowers and drones!

4434 S Meadow Ln

Our garden has been evolving over the last several years and now is home to several perennials that invite bumblebees and butterflies to visit us, highlighted by our beautiful Bird Girl statue replica. Landscape lights add drama and color to the garden and tie in our beautiful water feature.

13 4369 W 10th Street

Rear garden, featuring 4 trellises with vining perennial and annual flowers, stamped patio and sidewalk with container veggies, flowers and hanging flower pots with annuals, deer "resistant" enclosed vegetable garden, container gardens along the driveway and other perennials and annuals.

4325 Sunnyhill Cir

Entrance also through Bern Circle. Over 20 types of trees and shrubs including tupelo, elm, pawpaw, catalpa, gingko, river birch, bald cypress. Certified Monarch Waystation, NWF Habitat Area, Home Grown National Park, NE Ohio Native Habitat Corridor, rain garden, pollinator garden. Educational signs.

Back yard and front yard.

16 334 Skyview Rd

I've been gardening since I was very young. My father taught me to plant a garden and when I moved to my own house I planted a garden and did all the landscaping with the help of my husband and sons. I try to put different colors and different shapes to my garden.

Backyard garden with small pond and waterfall. Numerous flowers, vegetables, and herbs planted throughout the yard.

19 3444 Memphis Ave

Several garden beds, including a shade garden. The sidewalk garden is evolving and is a work in progress.

4009 Pensacola Ave

My home is a registered wildlife habitat through National Wildlife Federation, featuring double mini pond/fountain with bridge, hand made cedar lattice to keep deer thinking and bird houses for my wren friends who are currently nesting in them.

21 4088 W 57th St

Our garden is primarily perennial and sustains and invites a wide variety of birds and pollinators. Our love of local and migratory birds inspires most of the plantings, and we love when birds such as the Cape May Warbler spend a day or two in our yard.

22 4160 Ridgeview — Our Shambala

Newly added pollinator garden on former tree lawn. Beautifying the front yard with mostly colorful perennials while giving the backyard a rest this year.

23 6203 Brookside Dr

Corner lot including a Secret Garden. This year's theme colors are purple and yellow. All annuals are grown from seeds indoors under grow lights.

24 6203 Dellbank Dr

Fruit trees, berries, vegetable beds alongside pollinator beds filled with perennials shrubs young trees, and some annuals. Lots of bird houses, twig art and fencing just to make it a little bit more fun and a nifty way to recycle.

25 6212 Parkridge Ave

My gardens are deer resistant, pollinator friendly, and xeriscaped. My daughters will have their lemonade stand this year, with treats cultivated from our herbs and flowers.

26 Urban Farm — Orchard Grove Farm 6700 Orchard Grove Ave

Permaculture design, dozens of fruit trees, berry bushes, and perennials. Rain gardens, chickens, ducks, sustainable water harvesting and a couple ponds.

27 4385 W 60th St

Front yard has mixed fruit, vegetable, flowers and native butterfly garden. Doing my best to get rid of the lawn.

4902 Witchita Ave

I'm still in the process of working on my garden, featuring hostas, ferns and more

29 5316 Stickney Ave

My yard is a recently certified Wildlife Habitat by the National Wildlife Federation. Every year I put in more native plants, fruits and vegetables. While its pretty green in July still, I have a lot of late summer blooms that keep the wildlife happy with seeds all winter.

30 5608 Stickney Ave

Our home garden features over a dozen fruit trees (including the native Pawpaw), hazelnuts, and various berries. There's also a vegetable garden, and flowers for our pollinator friends.

31 5216 Ira Ave

We started with a bare canvas in 2020. This is what we've come up with so far...

32 6606 Flowerdale Ave

A modest pocket shade garden, offering respite from the summer sun, with just a touch of whimsy.

33 4623 W 41st St

Flower garden - daisy, iris, etc

34 4400 Archmere Ave

In the backyard of my 100 year-old home is a charming garden where you'll find a variety of vegetables, herbs and flowers in raised beds, pots and other colorful containers. Fun features this year are a salsa garden and a couple types of hydrangeas in full bloom!

35 3306 Walbrook Ave

Check out a pollinator's paradise in Old Brooklyn. This beautiful blooming front yard continues to grow every year with beautiful annuals and perennials replacing most of what you would see to be a typical front lawn.
